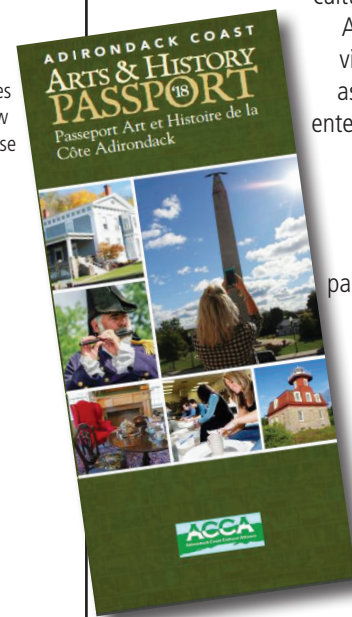

- ON SATURDAY - Children's Program - Dedicated Detectors from 11 to 2 p.m. Young visitors can use metal detectors to find hidden items just inches under their feet - everything from coins to nuts and bolts and springs - who knows what else may show up?
- EXHIBITIONS: The Museum features 3 floors of exhibit space with 6 galleries. Exhibits include: Early Industries in Clinton County, which highlights the CCHA's rare Redford Glass Collection; Clinton County's Military Timeline; Arts & Leisure over the years; The Clinton County Suffrage Story; and The History of the Town of Clinton. The Museum also hosts popular exhibits on the Bluff Point Lighthouse, CCHA's antique rifle and gun collection, and a new exhibit on Trains, Planes and Automobiles will be unveiled.

- The Plattsburgh Memorial Chapel was dedicated on October 24, 1933 Built in memory of those stationed at the Plattsburgh Barracks Army Post who gave their lives in World War I
- Project was sponsored by the Church Women's League for Patriotic Service costing \$22,472
- Constructed of weathered brick from a historical structure near Plattsburgh
- Chandeliers were made by the post blacksmith
- Pews and original organ were donated by the 26th Infantry
- Bell was installed in 1936 and came from the World War I ship the USS O'Brien
